The Matador Effect

For most of us in this fraternity, the word matador relates to a van that was plying on our roads either for transporting people or goods. I too belong to the same generation.

The name matador is derived from Spanish and when translated means Bullfighter. Though a very brutal sport, it is still practiced in some countries. Bullfighting is a physical contest that involves a bullfighter attempting to subdue, immobilize, or kill a bull, usually according to a set of rules, guidelines, or cultural expectations. There are several variations, including some forms that involve dancing around or leaping over a cow or bull or attempting to grasp an object tied to the animal's horns. The best-known form of bullfighting is Spanish-style bullfighting.

The bullfighter who faces the bull in the arena is called a Matador and one such Matador was a Columbian Alvaro Munera. During a fight, he collapsed in remorse mid-way when he realized he was having to prompt this otherwise gentle beast to fight. Torrero Munera is quoted as saying "And suddenly, I looked at the bull. He had this innocence that all animals have in their eyes, and he looked at me with this pleading. It was like a cry for justice, deep down inside of me. I describe it as being like a prayer - because if one confesses, it is hoped, that one is forgiven. I felt like the worst shit on earth." "Cows are amongst the gentlest of breathing creatures; none show more passionate tenderness to their young when deprived of them; and, in short, I am not ashamed to profess a deep love for these quiet creatures."

There are numerous versions of what happened to Alvaro Munera, it is believed that he is now confined to a wheelchair, a vegetarian; reflects on his past with sincere regret, and renounces bullfighting by working to ban this deadly pastime. The transition the matador went through is phenomenal and quiet rhetoric.

When I first made it to my club, I was less excited but rather more inquisitive about what Toastmasters is all about. The name did not corroborate with either communication or leadership. But what scored was the takeaway from each session which am proud to say have jotted down and do refer especially when contests are around the corner.

The transition in me from a conscious speaker to what am today is a matador change. As the fraternity trended, I too moved along; had vital opportunities, took on responsibilities, and realized that Toastmasters, unlike the name has transcended my thoughts, my outlook, and the way I look at things, thanks to the fraternity

Whenever an avid toastmaster, reflects his/her very first meeting and their last one, the transition in them will be gratifying. The contentment with themselves on why they dwelled along for years and continuing to do so is the change within, which enhances the confidence to face any challenge and improve to become a better human being. The reality is that whenever I come across consistent members in the fraternity, I believe that they are only competing with themselves intending to become better human beings. This, I believe is the Matador effect.


Is Frankincense (Bakhoor) an anticancer medicine?


Boswellia serrata is a plant that produces frankincense. The plant is native to much of <u>India</u> and the <u>Punjab region</u> that extends into Pakistan and is also native to Oman where it is popularly known as Bakhoor (frankincense). In human inflammation is a cause of many diseases including asthma, diabetes, cardiovascular disorders, arthritis and cancer. Inflammation is a result of many factors such as fatty food, excess body weight, lack of exercise, infection and allergies. Foods like dairy products, refined flour, wheat, red meat, processed food and trans fats are the culprits of increased inflammation in the body. Though inflammation controlled by taking care of the type of food we eat, there are other factors such as genetic, environmental etc which collaboration result in precipitation various pathological conditions in the body. The onset of such diseases impairs the lifestyle of a person to a large extent and ultimately life expectancy too. The pharma drugs used for treatment of diseases like asthma, diabetes, arthritis and cancer have to be consumed lifelong by the patient. The medicines apart from providing relief to the existing problems creates multitude side effects which may sometimes lead to more complications. Usually, organs like liver and kidneys are severely affected in many people following a long-term therapy regime specially chemotherapy used in cancer treatment. In recent times, the focus has been on natural compounds having potential therapeutic effect to reduce inflammation and be an option for deadly diseases such as cancer.






Extensive research shows that Boswellic serrata is a potent antioxidant, anti-inflammatory and anticancer agent. There is a lot of scientific literature available that highlights the impact of Boswellia serrata as an anticancer agent in breast cancer, prostate cancer, colon cancer and lung cancer. Experimental results have been positive in cancer cells in the lab and also in animal models such as mice and rats.

One major bottleneck for such natural compounds to be used as medicine is that they are degraded very rapidly in the human body. This results in low bioavailability of the molecule to target a particular tissue or cell. This limitation is being tackled by advancements in nanotechnology.



Using simple methods like forming an emulsion and reducing its size to nanometer range, the active molecule can be made bioavailable. Thus, a nanotechnology-based formulation of Boswellia serrata can be very promising for treatment of deadly diseases with more efficacy and negligible side effects. In future results from clinical trials on human will open the roads to incorporating molecules like Boswellia serrata as a therapeutic.
