



Each human being on this earth thrives to express themselves in various manners. According to a new study from psychologists at Queen's University (UK) using MRI brain scans, they were able to detect thought transitions and count the number of thoughts we have per day. On average, participants had 6.5 thoughts per minute, or 6200 thoughts per day. Aren't these facts amazing?

The best example where we can witness a harmonious blend is here at Toastmasters, where we are continually at a harmonious blend with our co-members, our leaders, and our guests. The 6200 thoughts that we have in our minds come out productively at our weekly toastmaster sessions in the form of various interactions as role players or through a project speech. In our project speeches, what do we usually do? We collect all our thoughts, memories, stories, incidents, etc., and present them in the form of a well-crafted speech.

I have been the VPE of my club for two consecutive years, and along with that, I have also been a part of the District 105 PR team for two consecutive years. This year, I am the assistant CGD for Division H. I was also in the second position for the humorous speech contest at DTAC 2023. 
How do you prepare yourself for a humorous speech contest?

The Toastmasters Humorous Speech Contest is an event where contestants present a thematic, humorous speech. The humor should be clean, avoiding objectionable language and material. The speech must have an opening, body, and conclusion and not be a monologue. Vocal variety, gestures, and speech content contribute to a successful, humorous speech. The contest allows Toastmasters to develop their humor, timing, and engagement while entertaining the audience. It's a celebration of wit, humor, and the art of public speaking. Writing a good humorous speech for a Toastmasters contest involves several key steps:

Pick one that you find amusing and can speak about comfortably. The more you enjoy the topic, the more likely your audience will too. The best humorous speeches use humor from beginning to end, not just in the punchline. Brevity is the soul of wit. Keep your jokes concise and get to the punchline quickly. Test out your jokes before telling them to an audience. This will help you gauge their effectiveness and make the necessary adjustments. Tailor your humor to your audience. What's funny to one group might not be to another. Writing an original, clean joke that will deliver a punch takes time and patience. To make humor work, the speaker must also properly place the joke within the speech, build appropriate context around it, and structure the speech effectively.

Remember, the key to a successful, humorous speech is to keep it light and fun and enjoy the process. Good luck with your contest!




